Why Christians Believe in the Trinity

God is the greatest Being you can know— Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. What God has revealed in His Word, the Bible, is intended for our learning (see Romans 15:4 and Deuteronomy 29:29). This Bible study supports the biblical doctrine that One God exists in Three Persons; commonly referred to as the Trinity. Due to the limited space in this tract, the reader is encouraged to cross-reference each verse with a good cross-reference Bible.

One God (Monotheism): Deuteronomy 4:39, 6:4; Isaiah 43:10, 44:8; Mark 12:32; James 2:19.

God is Spirit: John 4:24: 2 Corinthians 3:17.

The personal distinction of the Father, Son, and Spirit is shown:

In the incarnation (Luke 1:35).

In Christ's baptism (Matthew 3:16).

In the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19).

In Paul's Epistles (2 Corinthians 13:14).

All three Persons are called God in the truest sense of the term:

Father is God - Romans 1:7; 1 Corinthians 1:3.

Son is God - Isaiah 7:14, 9:6; Zechariah 12:10; Matthew 1:23, 22:41-45; Mark 2:7-10, 12:35-37; Luke 5:20-21, 20:41-44; John 1:1 and 14, 1:18 (only begotten God, in Greek, See New American Standard Bible), John 5:18, 8:58, 10:30-33, 20:28; Acts 20:28; Philippians 2:6-8; Colossians 2:9; Titus 2:10-13; Hebrews 1:6-8; 1 John 5:20; 2 Peter 1:1; Revelation 1:8.

Holy Spirit is God - 2 Samuel 23:2-3; Psalm 95:7-11 with Hebrews 3:7-19; Isaiah 6:8-10 with Acts 28:25-27; Jeremiah 31:33-34 with Hebrews 10:15-16; Acts 5:1-4; 1 Corinthians 6:19-20.

There is One Lord in the Bible, yet this One Lord is the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit: (One Lord) Ephesians 4:5; 1 Corinthians 8:6; (Father) Isaiah 64:8; Matthew 11:25; (Son) John 11:32; Acts 2:36; Romans 6:23; 1 Corinthians 8:6; Revelation 17:14 (Holy Spirit) 2 Corinthians 3:17.

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
